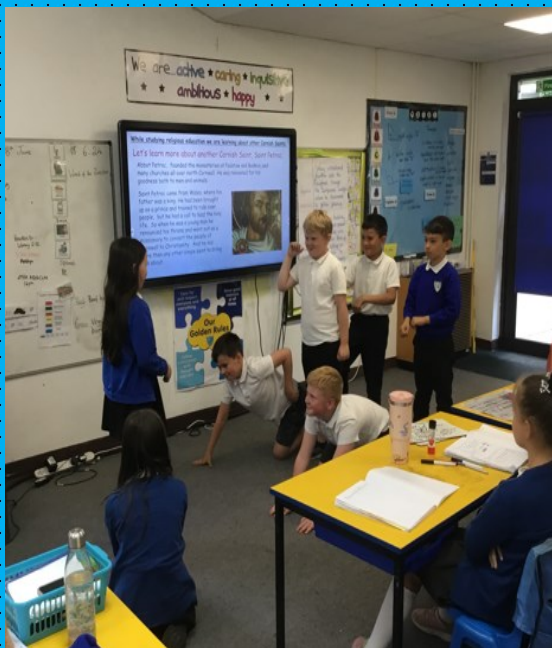

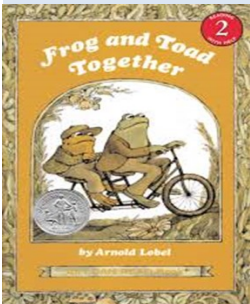
Next week, we are looking forward to drawing our own landscape scenes and using the water colour paints. We cannot wait!

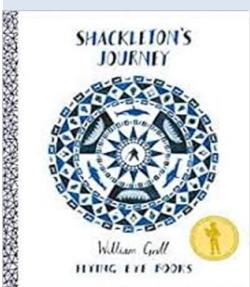


KS1 Book Of The Week: Frog and Toad Together
