



#### **Upcoming changes to childcare support**

The financial support that is available to parents to help with the cost of childcare is increasing. These include major changes to make it easier for parents with childcare responsibilities to move into or take on more paid work. Starting from April 2024, existing childcare support will be expanded in phases. By, September 2025, working parents with children aged 9 months old to when they start school

will be eligible for 30 hours childcare support.

We went to the Royal Cornwall Museum and learnt all about ancient Egypt! We learnt about, and got to hold, real ancient Egyptian artefacts. We also saw a real mummy AND learnt all about the mummification process.








As an exciting start to our new topic 'Dinosaur Discovery', year 1 have been investigating dinosaur poo! We discussed ways in which we know dinosaurs existed, from different

forms of remains. Then the children opened up pretend

'coprolites' (fossil poo) and talked about what the dinosaurs had eaten and what physical features they would have, such as sharp teeth and claws for eating meat or long necks for reaching leaves. Did you know that only about 35% of dinosaurs were carnivores?





The EYFS play area has had an amazing upgrade! Our friend Tim and his team have added road markings for bikes and scooters to improve balance and co-ordination,



blackboards for writing and mark making, monkey bars to improve upper body strength and seating for story- telling.

The children in the Nursery and Reception classes have loved exploring their new outdoor equipment!
