Over the past 12 months I have become increasingly concerned about the number of children who have their own social media accounts and private messaging accounts.

### Age requirements:

Snap Chat - Children must be 13+

Whatsapp - Children must be 13+


Facebook - Children must be 13+

We are frequently approached by parents who say that their child is receiving unkind messages on these platforms. Children are not mature enough at primary school age to have these platforms and as such unkindness does happen. It is not right, should not happen, but does, as the age restrictions are there for a reason and that is to keep children safe. Please do not allow your child to be on these platforms as this often leads to inappropriate behaviour.

If you do decide to ignore the age limit on these platforms and your child receives unkind messages please report them to the police. As a school we cannot supervise these platforms or children when they are not on school site. Please remember, allowing your child, despite their age, to access these platforms puts your child at risk.




