Cost of Living payments for families eligible for benefits-related Free School Meals

Last December, schools across Cornwall helped to deliver over £1.2 million from the Household Support Fund to families eligible for benefits-related Free School Meals. This support helped low income families manage the rising cost of living. Eligible families received payments of £80 per pupil in Reception to Year 11. Payments were issued in the form of payment codes which families could take to a Post Office to exchange for cash.

Cornwall CC have now received a further funding allocation through the Department for Work and Pensions Household Support

Fund and would like to make the same support available to families this year – £160 per pupil in Reception to Year 11 eligible for benefits-related Free School Meals. The support will be split across 2 payments of £80, one made in June and another in November.

inside balloons. Trapped inside the ice were bugs,




gems and even feathers. If you want to know how to melt an ice balloon just ask a Nursery Scientist! This week, Year 5 learned about coding with radio signals. We learned that




