Who Should I Speak With? Roskear Communication

Our school is organised to ensure that parents and carers always have an adult they can talk to if they feel concerned about their child or a school matter.

If you are concerned or need to share information about your child in relation to the class, we ask that you speak with the class teacher first. We do this as the class teacher will know the 'ins and outs' of the class and are likely to be the best first port of call.

We also have a KS1 Learning Mentor and a KS2 Learning Mentor, who can help if you are experiencing challenging or withdrawn behaviour from your child at home. If your concern is around attendance, then our Attendance Officer is also on hand daily to help you.

If you are concerned about something that cannot be shared with the teacher, learning mentor or attendance officer, or a matter that you have previously raised with these members of staff has not been addressed to your satisfaction, please contact one of the Phase Leaders.

If having spoken to the Phase Leader the problem/concern continues, please contact a member of the senior staff.

If your concern is around special educational needs and the teacher or Phase Leader has not been able to help, then please speak with the school SENDCo (Special Educational Needs Coordinator).






KS1 Book of the Week — Where the Wild Things Are
