Reading tips!

When sharing books with your child: Encourage them to hold the book and turn the pages themselves. Point out the front and back covers. Talk about the title and the author. Point to the words with your finger and talk about left to right. Look for letters your child may know e.g. letters in their own name. Say the letter sounds. Discuss the pictures. Predict what will happen next. Ask some questions at the end e.g. What was your favourite part? Why? Who was the main



character? etc.

<u>Self-care</u>

If you have a child in nappies by day, please start thinking about toilet training as soon as you can.

Independent use of the toilet really helps children to develop skills needed for school in September. Only two terms to go!
