

Key Vocabulary

dinosaur	Animals that lived on Earth more than 150 million years ago. They were lizard like reptiles.
scientist	A scientist tries to find out how our world, or other things, work.
palaeontologist	People who studied plants and animals that lived millions of years ago. They look for fossils.
evidence	A sign, which shows that something exists or is true.
fossil	Fossils are the remains of plants and animals that lived long ago. Fossils give scientists clues from the past.
extinct	When an entire species, or type of animal dies out. Once a species becomes extinct, it is gone forever.
skeleton	A framework of bones that supports a body.
predator	An animal that hunts, catches and eats other animals.
carnivore	An animal that eats only meat.
herbivore	An animal that eats only plants.
omnivore	An animal that eats meat and plants.

Significant Person

Mary Anning was born in 1799. She was too poor to go to school so she taught herself how to read and write. She spent most her time searching the beaches, looking for fossils. Over her life, she made incredible discoveries, which helped us to understand what dinosaurs used to be like. She was one of the most famous scientists and palaeontologists to have ever lived. During her life, her achievements were never recognised because she was a woman. Mary Anning lived in the Victorian era.
