Forests Boreal Forest Boreal forests are characterised by long, cold and dry winters and short, warm and moist summers. A forest found between the Temperate Forest tropical and boreal regions, located in the temperate zone. A type of forest found in Tropical Forest areas with regular high rainfall and no more than 2 months of low rainfall. It consists of a completely closed canopy of trees that prevents sunlight getting to the ground and prevents ground-cover growth. **Types of Trees** Forests are being burned down to make Broadleaved way for cattle farming, supplying beef **Forests** to the rest of the world. Soil soon becomes dry and cattle farmers have to move on leaving a trail of destruction behind. The demand for minerals and metals Conifer Forests such as oil, aluminium, copper, gold and diamonds mean that rainforests are destroyed to access the ground below. Chemicals used can often end up in rivers, polluting water supplies. Large dams are used to help with the creation of electricity. This is seen as 'clean' energy but has resulted in the flooding of large areas of rainforest.

The New Forest is one of the largest forests in Southern England. The New Forest is a temperate deciduous forest.



8 points of a compass.

We use compass points to describe position and direction. There are 4 main points of a compass. We can be more specific if we use 8 compass points. These come half way between the main points and are called north-east (NE), south-east (SE), south-west (SW) and north-west (NW).
