Physical Features	
Rivers	Mississippi River, Missouri River, Rio Grande, Columbia River, Colorado River, Hudson River
Deserts	Four major deserts – Great Basin, Mohave, Chihuahuan and Sonoran
Mountains	Appalachian Mountains, Rocky Mountains.
Lakes	Lake Superior, Lake Ontario, Lake Michigan, Lake Erie and Lake Huron.
Eco-systems	North America has a variety of different biomes because of its vast size. It consists of tundra, boreal/taiga, rainforest, grassland, desert, temperate, savannah biomes.
The Grand Canyon	An enormous carved canyon in the ground formed by the Colorado River, which began 5-6 million years ago. It runs 1800m deep and 18 miles wide and is in Arizona in western U.S.A.
