School Attendance

As you will know parents and carers have a legal duty to ensure their child attends school regularly and punctually. This means children must attend every day that the school is open, except in a small number of allowable circumstances, such as being too ill to attend or being given permission for an absence in advance from the school by completing a Leave of Absence form (LOA). These can be located on our school website or from the main office.

If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may result in legal action. Absence not authorised by the school may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444 (1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court.

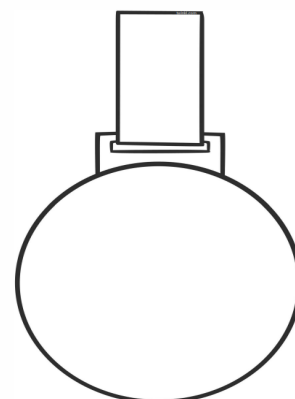
With an adult at home:

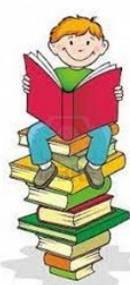

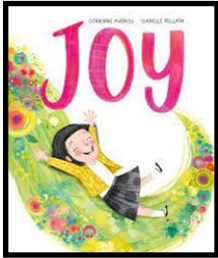
35 Books to read before you leave Year 2

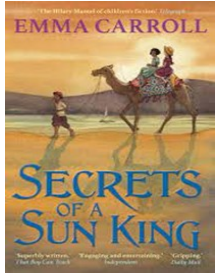

Online gaming, including what is considered to be acceptable use

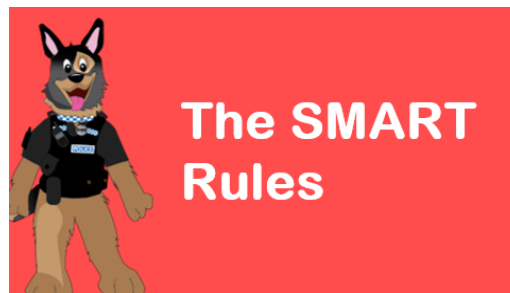
Age ratings for popular platforms

We also looked at 5 rules for internet safety that will help children when they are online:



S - SAFE

Be careful not to give out personal information like your name, age, pictures, passwords, email address or phone numbers.



M - MEETING

Meeting someone you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Only do so with permission. It's best to chat only online to people you know in real life.


A - ACCEPTING

Email, instant and direct messages or opening files, images or texts from people you don't know can lead to problems.




R - RELIABLE

Not all the information you see on the internet is accurate. Anyone can put things on the internet, so always check by looking at other websites or asking someone that you know.



T - TELL

Tell a parent, carer, teacher, trusted friend or adult if anything makes you upset or you are being bullied online.



Our Year 6 pupils then had an additional session regarding online chat groups and how it can make people feel when someone is saying unkind things. The key messages from our police officers were:

Think before you post – if you wouldn't like someone to say it to you, don't post it.

Online abuse can be just as damaging as physical abuse.

Unkind words can have a lasting and detrimental effect.

Follow the moral code – is what you are going to say/post the right thing to do?

Think: if one of your grown ups saw what you had posted, would they be happy?

There are no such things as secrets online.

Always seek permission before posting photos/videos of others.
