Roskear’s Reading Journey

At Roskear Primary and Nursery School and Crofty Minors Preschool we are passionate about reading. By reading every day we take children into a world that goes beyond our typical everyday spoken language. Our texts are carefully chosen to complement our school drivers, ensuring children learn about: the environment, both local and the wider world; how to build resilience; how changes affect us emotionally, locally and globally; to communicate in an increasingly complex world; to be curious about the world they live in. They have also been selected to ensure they help our children prepare for life in modern Britain. We are determined that every child leaves Roskear with a passion for reading so that they become lifelong readers. We begin the reading journey in FS1 where children have many wonderful stories read to them. We believe stories teach children to:

- *Sustain attention*
- *Learn thousands of new words*
- *Hear patterns in words and phrases*
- *Understand emotions*
- *Build pictures in their minds from the words on the page*
- *Understand the nuance of humour*
- *Follow a plot with all its twists and turns*
- *Use inference to read between the lines and predict what’s about to happen.*

In nursery, we also learn whole stories and encourage children to take books home to share with parents and carers. Children in nursery also begin learning letters and sounds Phase 1 (Early Phonics) and in Summer 1 we start to introduce RWI.

In Reception and Years 1 to 6 we have an author focus for each half term, with 5 books written by this author available to be read so that children become familiar with at least 6 authors each year. By the time they leave our school they will have extensive knowledge of at least 42 children's authors.

As well as this, each class has their own class library with carefully selected books to read before you leave each year group, these include fiction, non-fiction and poetry and across KS2 (Years 3 to 6). These are regularly updated with new releases.

We also have high quality non-fiction books that complement our Units of Learning available in each class.

Children also have daily access to our fabulous, well stocked library which is open during lunchtime for free access. We also have an extensive range of levelled books that children can take home to read as part of our Accelerated Reader program.






