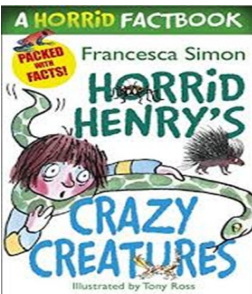
A big thank you to Charlotte and Wayne for the music, lights and great costumes.

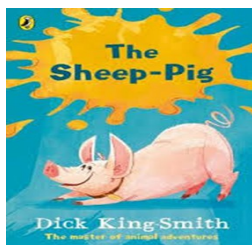

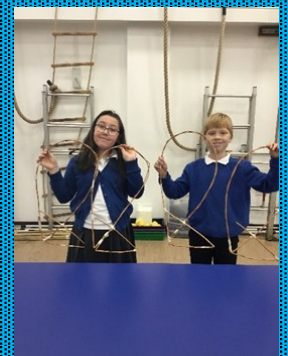
