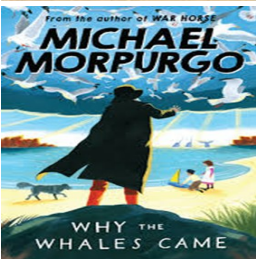

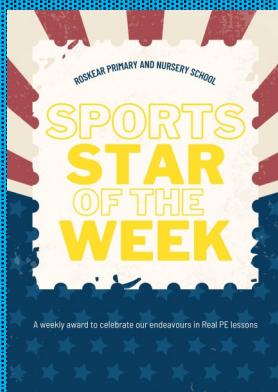
## Team 5 & 6
