




This week in team EYFS...

Each day in school, we retell the story using the puppets and we like to draw story maps too. We have used our story maps to retell the story to our friends.





Stunning Start: Frostbite Fingers

For our stunning start into the topic Pole to Pole, we created Frostbite Fingers! We learnt all about frostbite and how an explorer may contract it (in their fingers/toes/ears/cheeks) and discussed how they could avoid it.
