

I wish you all a relaxing weekend. Take care.







busy learning about body parts and our

This week. Year 5 have been scientists and have carried out an experiment. They investigated the impact of bicarbonate of soda on an acid (vinegar). They made predictions and then carried out the experiment. We kept all the variables the same (the size of the bottle, quantity of vinegar and balloon sizes). We changed one variable: The amount of bicarbonate of soda. We noticed that the more bicarbonate of soda is used the more gas is produced from the chemical reaction. We know that this is an irreversible change.










Congratulations to Wykenzi for receiving the rank of 4th Kyu in recognition of her constant efforts in the Ryukyu Kobudo both in mind and skill.


