Lost and Found

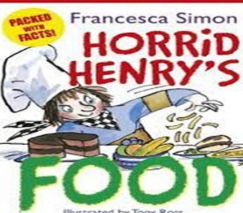
The lost and found will be held in the Hall on Monday the 20th. Text with the time to be sent on Monday.

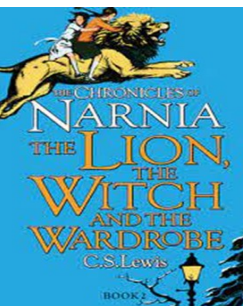
A HORRID FACTBOOK

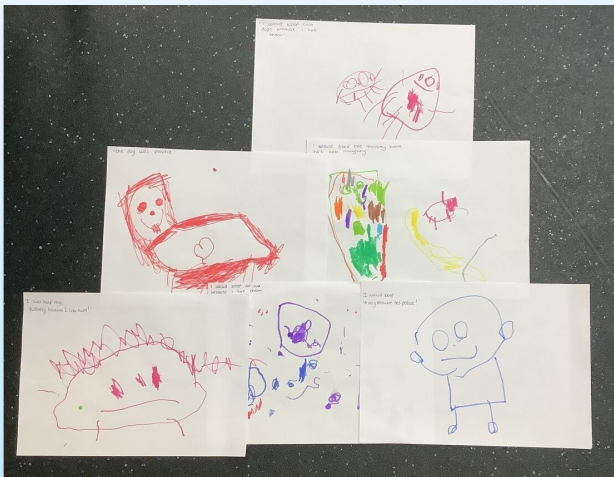

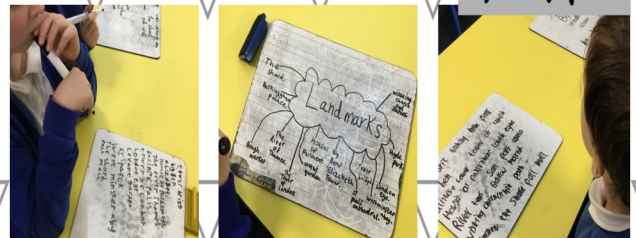

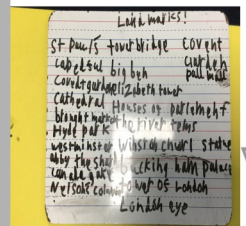

Our designs had to help people move water to the summit of a mountain.

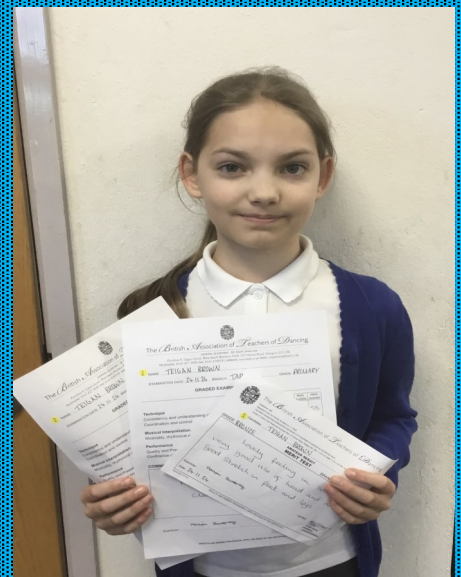
To create functional mechanisms, we had to plan and evaluate.
