#### Lost and Found


The lost and found will be held in the Hall on Monday the 27th. Text with the time to be sent on Monday.



We have a lot of lost uniforms, coats etc to be collected. If you know you have something lost, please come and look.








KS1 Book Of The Week: Willa and Old Miss Annie Author: Berlie Doherty Book Level: 4.4

We have had fun spotting birds in our early years garden. We have also taken the survey home, to see what birds we can spot! Why not look outside, what birds can you see?








This week in Year 2 we have been creating suspense in our writing. We thought of different scary settings, ways to create suspense and how to show what our character is feeling in different ways.



As scientists this week Year 5 have been investigating the moon. We used a ping pong ball to model how the moon orbits around the Earth. The moon has phases' which means it looks a little different to us each night. We described how the Moon looks using terms such as 'Full moon 'first quarter' and 'New Moon'. The Moon has no light of its own. Moonlight is sunlight reflecting off the Moon's surface, as the Moon orbits the Earth the sun lights up the side of the Moon that is facing it. We drew a representation of this.
