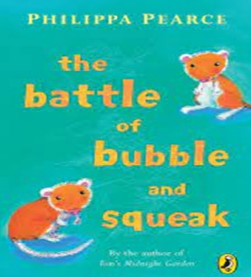
Finally, I wish you a sunny weekend. Take care.

Any children found without parents / carers supervising before this time, will be taken to the breakfast club and parents / carers will be charged.

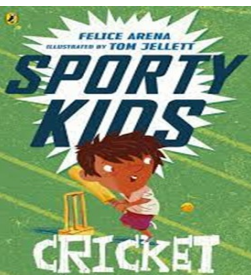
