## Lost and Found

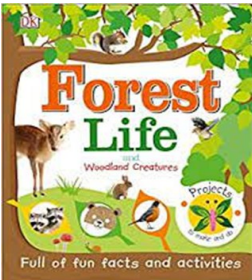
The lost and found will be held in the hall on Monday the 10th of March.

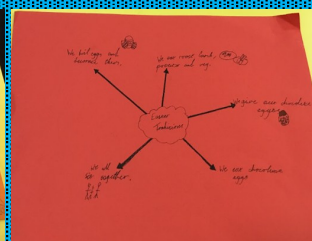
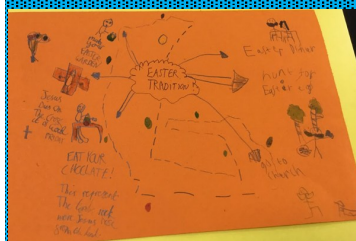
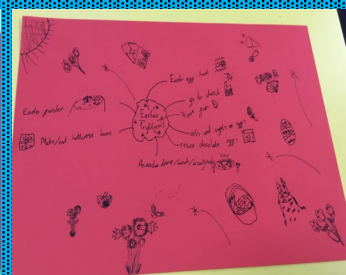
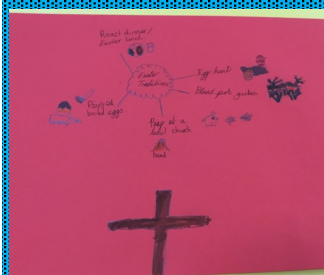
## Team 1 & 2

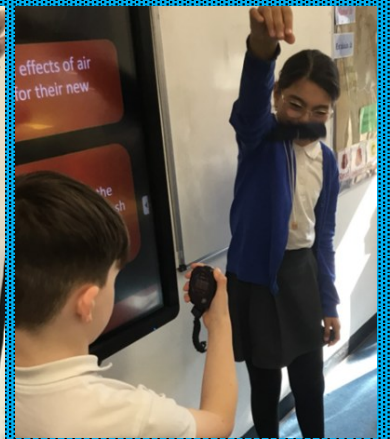

They learnt that air resistance pushes in the opposite direction to the way the object is moving; it is a type of friction and that it pushes back on an object which could change the shape. The children then planned an experiment to investigate how the weight of a parachute could impact on the time it takes to land.
