Lost and Found


The lost and found will be held in the hall on Monday the 10th of March.






KS1 Book Of The Week: Forest Life and Woodland Creatures



There was a competition for the best dressed in each year group. The winners will each receive a book token.





They learnt that air resistance pushes in the opposite direction to the way the object is moving, it is a type of friction and that it pushes back on an object which could change the shape. The children then planned an experiment to investigate how the weight of a parachute could impact on the time it takes to land.
