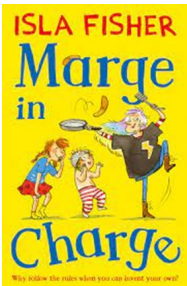
Finally, I wish you all a wonderful weekend. Take care.

Please note that due to teacher training, there will be no teacher-led clubs next week, **except** for Mrs William's Art Club on Thursday.

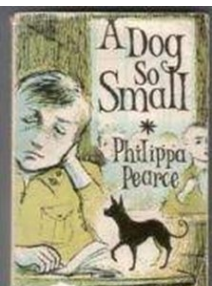
After-School Club (Homework Club) will continue as normal each day. Thank-you

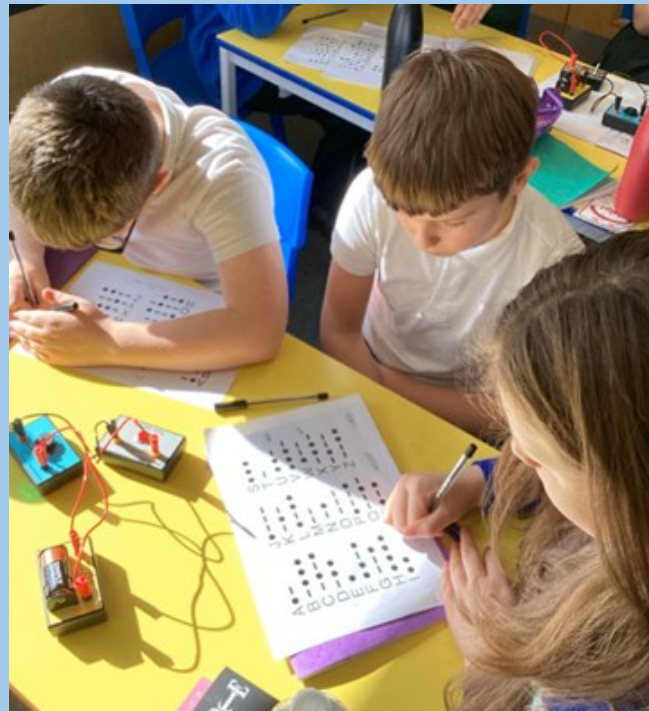
