Dear Parent/Carer,



Lost PE Hoodie



Last week, Gwithian class took part in an exciting and hands-on science activity where we explored textures and materials. The children had a lot of fun as we ventured out onto the school playground, each with a rocket template in hand.

The goal was for each child to find a material that might match what they think a space rocket could be made of. As they explored, they were encouraged to shout out when they found something they wanted to investigate further.

When they found a material, they placed their rocket template on it and described what the texture felt like. For example, if a child found something too bumpy or rough, they would say, "That's not my rocket, it's too bumpy." Some of the children made amazing discoveries, like finding a shiny metal pipe or a smooth plastic surface, which reminded them of the surface of a real space rocket.

Overall, the activity was a wonderful opportunity for the children to explore the world around them, use descriptive language, and think creatively about the materials that make up a rocket. I am so proud of how well they took part, and I look forward to more exciting activities like this in the future!









During religious education, Falmouth Class thought about how Jesus lived a perfect life in order to please God and give salvation to all Christians. They considered the selfless deeds he did and then discussed what they could do to help others around them. They wrote their ideas on leaves to create a class 'salvation' tree.
