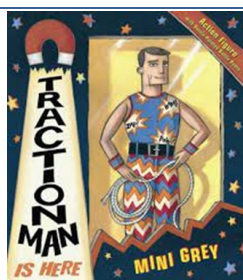

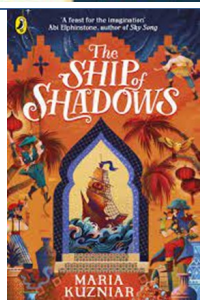


### KS1 Book Of The Week: **Traction Man is Here**

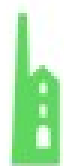

## A3047 Roskear, Camborne

We wrote to you recently to let you know about the works taking place at Roskear on the A3047, as part of the Camborne Town Deal. The project is progressing well and we're now moving on to a phase that will affect your property more directly, for a short period.

Commencing on 21<sup>st</sup> May for approximately one week, a lighting column is to be relocated, and additional columns installed along the footway outside your property. In order to do so we must dig a pit in the footway to expose the cabling connection and join the new lights to the existing system. This needs to take place outside your property and so your vehicular access will be periodically restricted to allow the works.

The site team will make every effort to accommodate anyone needing to get their vehicles passed, moving the machinery and laying steel plates to do so. However, we would ask that where possible, you give them notice and allow a little extra time on your journeys, so that they can make safe the section of footway that their working on and see you safely through.

The majority of the time, this particular work will commence at 9am and the machinery should be off the road by 4pm.

We appreciate this may cause you some temporary disruption and very much appreciate your patience and understanding. 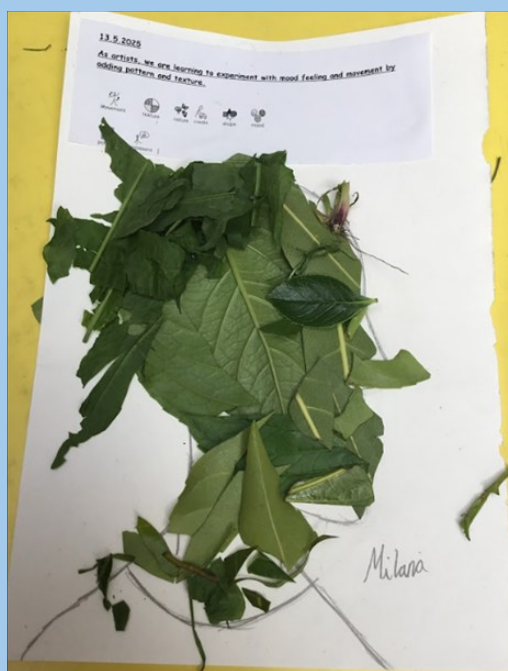
