This week, many of our Year 6 children went to London, to explore the capital. The children had a fabulous time and were exceptionally well behaved.



We learnt all about why people visit the woods, what you can do there and how we can care for our woodland.


Thank-you to all those parents who were able to help. What a wonderful day had by all!

Author: Nadia Shireen AR Book Level: No AR quiz


Billy and the Beast by Nadia Shireen tells the story of our heroine, Billy, and how her bravery helps her to overcome a terrible beast.




KS2 Book Of The Week: Harley Hitch and the Iron Forest

When Harley Hitch and her new friend Cosmo notice an unusual fungus growing in the Iron Forest, they set out to discover who - or what - is behind it.





In the Pre-School room, we are able to take children from 2years-old.

We offer morning and afternoon sessions for our Pre-School children.

If there are spaces, extra sessions are available at a charge of £12 for a three hour session and the forty five minute lunch time wrap around care at the cost of £3.





Children can choose to do their learning indoors or outdoors where they will be given opportunities to be active or they may want to find a cosy place to relax.





Funding

Parents of two-year-olds can access 15 hours a week of funded childcare if they receive additional forms of support.

From September 2025, 30 hours childcare support will be extended to eligible working parents of children from the term after their child turns two years old.

All parents of children aged three can access a universal offer of 15 hours of childcare from the term after their child turns three.
