This week year 4 have been learning about conductors and insulators.

We learnt that a conductor is something that will conduct electricity and that an insulator is something that electricity will not pass through.

We were given a range of different objects and we had to predict if the object would be a conductor or insulator.

We then created a simple series circuit and tested each object.

We then looked at the developmental milestones of birth and how a baby develops from birth to one year.

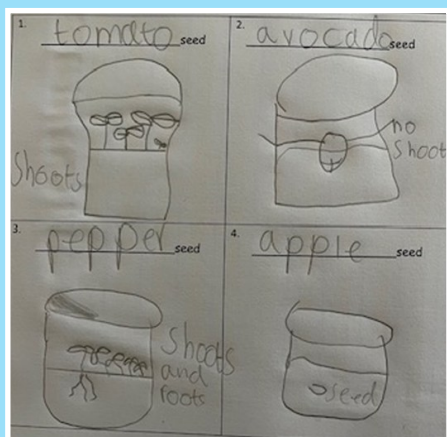
We worked in small groups to match a picture (who), with a what might be happening (what) to the correct age (when).

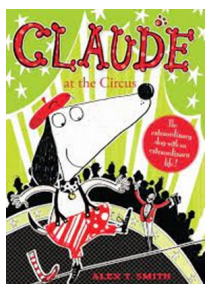

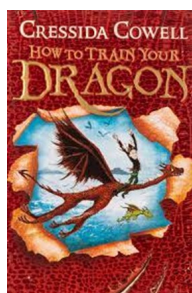
KS1 Book of the Week

Arbor Parent App and Parent Portal

In November last year we moved our Management Information System from SIMS to Arbor. The key reasons for the move were to allow us to communicate more efficiently with our parents and ensure that all core school data is kept in one system.

We are now ready to start using the Arbor Parent Portal and Parent App. Initially we will use this for communicating with you through in-app messages and emails. You will also be able to update the data we hold on you through the App instead of having to talk directly to the school office. For instance, if you move house or change your mobile number. In the future we will look at other areas that we can use e.g. parental consultations.

The **Parent App** is the mobile version of our Parent Portal, for use on mobile devices such as smartphones and tablets.

The **Parent Portal** is a version of Arbor accessible to guardians on a laptop or computer.
