
#### IMPORTANT—ACTION REQUIRED .... Arbor Parent App and Parent Portal

We are now ready to start using the Arbor Parent Portal and Parent App. Initially we will use this for communicating with you through in-app messages and emails. You will also be able to update the data we hold on you through the App instead of having to talk directly to the school office. For instance, if you move house or change your mobile number. In the future we will look at other areas that we can use e.g. parental consultations.

- The **Parent App** is the mobile version of our Parent Portal, for use on mobile devices such as smartphones and tablets.




## Team 1 & 2



#### Year 5:

This week Year 5 have been investigating how to separate sugar and water from a solution. We firstly experimented with evaporation: applying heat to the solution so that the liquid turns to gas and evaporates, leaving the solid sugar behind. We discussed where and when evaporation occurs and they identified real-life scenarios where evaporation would be useful. After that, we looked at filtration: using filter paper, which has tiny holes letting liquid through but not small solid particles, we filtered the solution. This method did not work as the sugar was completely dissolved in the solution. We discussed real-life scenarios where filtration could be used.
