Our new Roskear Parent Partnership group met last week and discussed a variety of matters which were then shared with the senior leadership team. It was great to see so many parents and carers together for our first meeting of the year.

As you know we value all parental contributions and it is our aim to resolve any matters as swiftly as possible while ensuring we continue improving the provision for all our children and the wider school community.

We briefly discussed the priorities for the year from the school development plan (SDP):

- Raising standards in reading, writing and maths.
- Ensure a fully inclusive culture across the school, enabling all children to succeed academically, socially and emotionally.
- Further secure high standards of behaviour and attitudes through relational practice.
- Ensure effective leadership at all levels works coherently to continue to develop an enabling and ambitious school for all children.

We shall review progress within these priorities at our termly meetings.

The following matters were also raised during the meeting:

Car parking

The issue of 'car parking' both on site and alongside roads in our neighbourhood was raised and I would like to remind everyone using the school car park to only park in the marked bays, turn off engines and only manoeuvre out of the bay once the barrier has been opened. This ensures we keep all pedestrians safe. We trust that any parents / carers who park within our Roskear neighbourhood will do so safely, while adhering to the roadside markings. This will help to ensure the safety of all children and adults. Thank you.

We discussed ways parents / carers can contact their child's teacher, as we know that communication is very important for everyone. Please remember to raise any queries you may have with your child's teacher first. If are unable to see them face-to-face please phone the school office and leave a message. We trust this may be helpful especially if your child attends the after school club. We are always keen to have contact with parents and carers and we know that building positive relationships with children and their families is particularly important.

Reading

As you are aware any child in KS2 who does not read at home will spend 5 minutes reading at break time with one of the teachers enabling them to catch up with their reading. They are still able to enjoy their breaktime with friends once they have completed their reading. Please encourage your child to read at home as we know that promoting a love of reading and sharing books together will support your child in their wider learning journey.
